

## **BEARS REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS**

### **Football:**

Upperclassman – Registration \$1850

Freshmen – Registration \$1550

### **Cheer:**

Registration \$1125

**Equipment Deposit** - \$100 for everyone (football and cheer)

**Penalty Fee:** \$50 for anyone who did not return last year's gear by this June 1<sup>st</sup>.

### **Deadlines:**

#### **Football Upperclassmen**

Gearout: \$550 (includes \$100 equip dep) + any penalty fee or camp costs

August 3: \$600

August 24<sup>th</sup> \$500

September 21<sup>st</sup> \$300

#### **Football Freshmen**

Gearout: \$550 (includes \$100 equip dep) + any penalty fee or camp costs

August 3: \$500

August 24<sup>th</sup> \$400

September 21<sup>st</sup> \$200

#### **Cheer**

Gearout: \$425 (includes \$100 equip dep) + any penalty fee

August 24<sup>th</sup> \$500

September 21<sup>st</sup> \$300

Amounts can be paid by cash or equivalent or fund-raising (chore-buster, program book ad, raffle sale).

Program book advertisement deadline will be August 3<sup>rd</sup>. Thus, although Cheer has a later first turn in, if they want to cover fundraising with program ads, they still need to be turned in by August 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Above fundraising does not include Oregon cost, which will be fundraised separately. However, to be eligible to travel, above schedule must be adhered to.

For a family with more than two Crimson Bear participants, discounts will be applied proportionately to all Crimson Bear participants equally. Discount will be applied equally to the first three deadlines. The family discount starting with the 3<sup>rd</sup> Crimson Bear will be \$900 per additional participant, which would reduce each of the first three payments by \$100 for each participant. For four participants, the total discount would be \$1800 and

would reduce each of the first three payments by \$150 for each participant. If a family has five or more Crimson Bear participants, we will discuss individually.

A participant who is registration deficient may participate in practice and be on the sideline out of uniform but may not travel or participate in a game until they meet the registration requirements.

Scholarship recipients must have notice of receipt of scholarship to receive credit for scholarship or match. A participant who wants to draw gear early must meet above deadlines (fundraising would enable this to happen). When scholarship received, would reduce next turn-in requirement.

If a player decides not to play due to injury or other reasons, only the cash paid portion of registration is refundable to the participant. Registration paid by fundraising will be retained for general program needs. If gear is drawn, a \$50 restock fee will apply unless withdrawal due to injury. No portion of registration will be refunded after the first game.

Equipment deposit must be paid with cash due to non-refundable fund raising policy.

Above registration for Cheer assumes they do not travel to West Valley or first playoff game. Travel to Oregon dependent on fundraising necessary amount.

## **EXTENUATING CIRCUMSTANCES:**

Under the following circumstances, registration requirements will be relaxed:

New transfer to Juneau – a participant who moves to Juneau after April 30th will be entitled to a reduction in their registration requirement due to limited ability to do earlier fundraising and lack of community familiarity. Reduction shall apply to earliest required payments (excluding camp fees and equipment deposit) until reduction is met.

Reduction amount is:

- Move to Juneau in May \$400
- Move to Juneau in June \$600
- Move to Juneau in July or later \$800

Participant unable to travel due to medical reasons or family emergency - a participant will be eligible for a \$300 credit for each missed travel.

- Credit is not refundable. A participant who completed all of his/her fundraising and then misses a travel opportunity is not entitled to a refund.
- Credit must be restored for each playoff travel (or for Oregon travel). Example: varsity player misses West Valley game due to medical reasons. He has \$300 credit. In order to travel to the first road playoff game, he needs to pay/ fundraise the \$300 he received in credit as it is an extra travel.
- A pre-approved excused absence will be treated the same as a medical/ family emergency absence.
  - Examples of excused absences include but are not limited to: traveling for different sport or family vacation that delays reporting date for Football and attendance at college preparatory testing such as ACT or SAT.
  - In no circumstances will the following be considered as an excused absence
    - Late decision to play football causing ineligibility due to insufficient practices
    - Academic ineligibility
    - School suspension
  - Final approval on granting credit for excused absence will be with the JYFL Board in consultation with the team coaches and the school athletic director.

## **TRAVEL POLICY –**

For regular season games (exception of Oregon trip), all participants who are medically, academically, behaviorally and financially eligible to participate, will travel. Players medically unable to travel can travel by foregoing their \$300 credit and paying the difference between the cost of their ticket and \$300.

Board, in consultation with the varsity coaches, reserves right to place travel squad restrictions on trip to Oregon and playoffs due to financial limitations.
